





DETROIT PUBLISHING CO. FLATIRON BUILDING, NEW YORK, N.Y. 1902 8×10" GLASS NEGATIVE

The Flatiron Building, originally the Fuller Building, is a triangular 22-story, 285' tall steel-framed building located on a block formed by Fifth Avenue, Broadway, and East 22nd Street in New York City. The building has been called a quintessential symbol of New York and one of the world's most iconic skyscrapers. It's a popular spot for tourist photographs and is among the most photographed buildings in the world.

It still serves as a functioning office building, known for having strangely-shaped offices with walls that cut through at an angle on their way to the skyscraper's famous point. These "point" offices look directly upon the Empire State Building—built almost 30 years after the Flatiron Building was finished.
