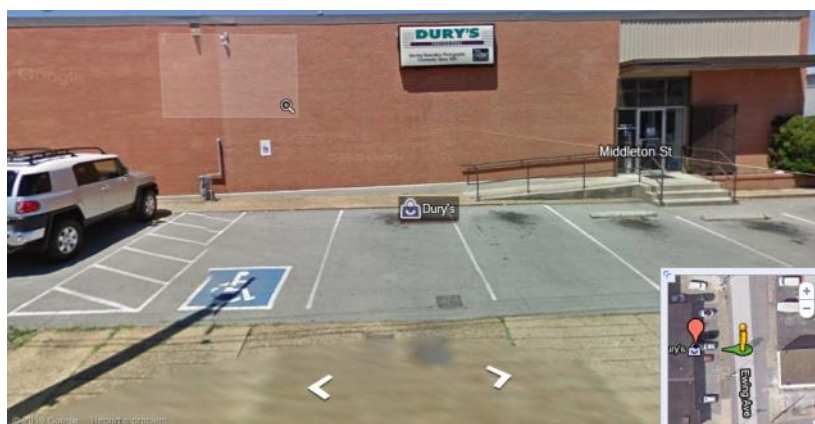
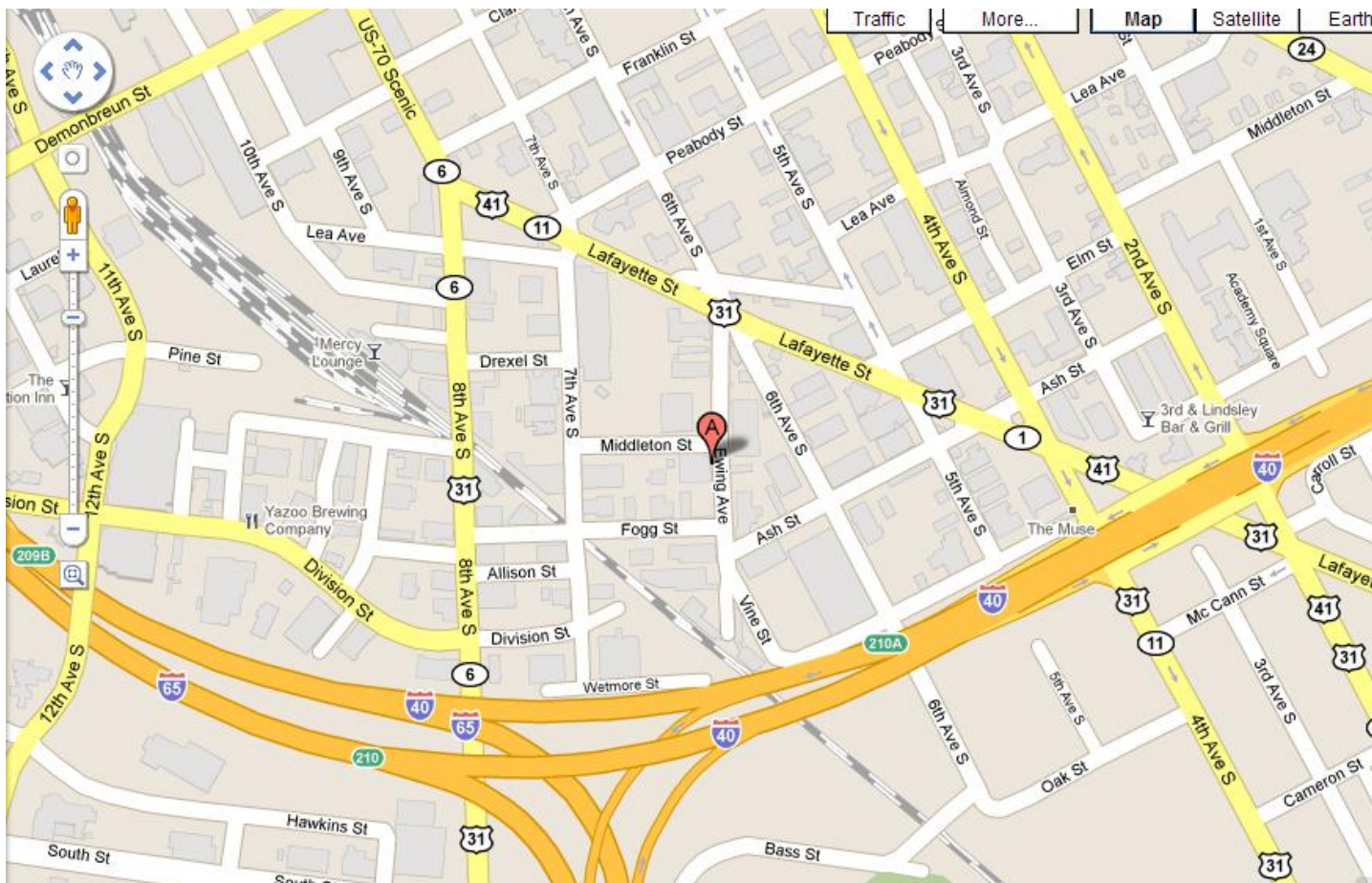

Classes they have listed for the Saturday sessions include:

Session I 9:00 - 11:00 a.m. Photo Basics I, or Workflow: Processing your Images with Adobe Lightroom, Session II 11:15 a.m. - 1:15 p.m Photo Basics II, or Understanding Exposure: Using the Zone System, Session III 2:30 - 4:30 p.m. Introduction to Macro Photography, or Understanding Light

Classes they have listed for the Sunday sessions include:

Session I 8:30 - 10:30 a.m. Shooting and Processing HDR and Panoramic Images, or Composition: Designing a Great Photo

Session II 10:45 a.m. - 12:45 p.m. Landscape Photography or Photographing People

Session III 2:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m Critique session

Stroll through a tropical forest where colorful macaws and swirling butterflies greet you. Plan at least two hours for your aquarium visit.

Aquarium admission includes access to both River Journey and Ocean Journey.

Take I-24 to downtown Chattanooga to Exit 178/US

Hwy 27 North to Exit 1-C/4th Street.

Take a right onto 4th Street.

Turn left at the second stoplight onto Broad Street.

Go two blocks and see Aquarium. Parking and free shuttle are available.

We are hoping to visit the Chattanooga Nature Center for a Sandhill Crane program along with a speaker to learn about these beautiful birds. There are also a lot of other animals for us to enjoy there too !
