
MAY TOM VENTRESS Use or Abuse? How a Designer Might Treat Your Photos

om Ventress wasn't always a graphic designer. He arrived in Nashville to work at Gruhn Guitars, repairing musical instruments and creating intricate mother-of-pearl inlays for the likes of Jimmy Buffet, Steve Martin, Bela Fleck, The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, and ZZ Top, among others, earning him the nickname "The Pearl Wizard". Long hours of careful hand sawing through delicate shell sharpened his eye and fired an appreciation for beautiful form, leading to art school where he majored in illustration and developed a good sense for composition. While in school, he became junior designer in the Vanderbilt design office, where a deep affinity for typography formed.

A friend observed that Tom's penchant for puns serves his designs as he works with a wide range of clients—from entrepreneurs to institutions to national and international corporations. Along the way he's picked up numerous national and international awards for design, illustration, and photography.

Tom approaches his own photography from the perspective of a graphic designer, always keeping the end use—or potential end use—of a shot in mind. He also commissions other photographers and buys stock photography for assignments. His presentation will offer insight to anyone who accepts commercial or editorial assignments in their photographic practice, or offers their images for sale through stock photography agencies.

Carol M. Highsmith has donated over 42,000 photographs to the Library of Congress and aims to donate 100,000 images. By doing so she places her photos in the public domain and relinquishes all copyrights to her work.

In July 2016, Highsmith instituted a \$1.35 billion lawsuit against two stock photography organizations, Getty Images and Alamy, and their agents, over their attempts to assert copyright over, and charge fees for the use of, 18,755 of her images, after Getty sent her a bill for one of the images, which she used on her own website. In November 2016, after the judge hearing the case dismissed much of Highsmith's case on grounds that she had relinquished her claim of copyright when she donated much of her work to the Library of Congress. The remainder of the lawsuit was settled by the parties out of court.
