
Our course will meet for 13 weeks and cover basic capture photography. We will meet at my home located at 308 Ash Grove Drive, Nashville Tn. 37211. Directions as follows, from Harding Place and Nolensville Rd. go South on Nolensville Rd. to Ash Grove Drive on the left (AUTO LATINO USED CARS on the corner). Turn onto Ash Grove Drive and go to 308 Ash Grove Drive.
